TCP Anniversary Celebration Wednesday 9/22

Yet, as we were about to select one of the groups, we learned that TGA was also trying to have an American Indian group perform at its Savoring Sister Cities event. Your executive committee felt that having two similar presentations on successive evening would not be something our members would want. It was then that Barbara found the Selby Minner web site <http://www.dcminnerblues.com>. A quick survey of some members of our Executive Committee, some members of our partnership, and of some members the TGA staff, showed that all these people thought that a blues band would be a typical American experience for our guests and it was decided to proceed with this last alternative.

We are pleased to report that both Celle Mayor Mende, and Tulsa Mayor Bartlett will be joining us for this celebration dinner.
