Program: The group will be discussing some of the latest German events which have been recently reported on the news. After that, Barbara will be demonstrating the “Logitech Revue”. John Toschik was the first TCP member to use and recommend this \$100 device. The Logitech Revue allows its users to easily access German (and other international) internet TV programs, and German internet TV news without using a computer.

Your TV must have a HDMI port to connect to the Logitech Revue. “Revue comes with an easy to set up companion box and an intuitive keyboard controller. Simply connect your TVand your internet connection to the Logitech Revue, and you’ve got Google TV.” Google TV allows you to “surf” the internet like you would with a computer. However, we found that a computer is more responsive in some situations.

Stay on the Tisdale Parkway until it ends.


Turn left on 36th Street North.

Program: Bob Potiss, the Port Director, will give us a guided tour of the facility and of the museum. We are also investigating the possibility of taking a short barge trip around the harbor. The Partnership is making plans to provide refreshments for a small reception.

The Port of Catoosa has been in operation for 40 years, and it currently handles 2.2 million tons of cargo a year. The port covers 2000 acres, and 63 companies are based there. The port has a general dry cargo dock, a roll-on roll-off low water wharf, a dry bulk terminal, a grain terminal, and a bulk liquid terminal.

Bob has told us that one of the port's memorable events was a visit in 1986 by the German ocean going freighter "Frauke".

Past Membership Meetings

8/5 Beer Stein Presentation

Forty Partnership members and guests gathered in the GAST Center Weinkeller to listen to Dave Schoeneweis' presentation on beer steins. While we munched on German-style Pretzels and other snacks offered by the Partnership, Dave allowed us to pass around many valuable steins from his collection, and we all admired their intricate details and beauty.



Dave mentioned that some steins come in sets consisting of a 1/3 liter stein, a 1/2 liter stein, and a 1 liter stein. He also explained how to identify the origin of a stein by looking at the stamp located at the bottom of each valuable piece. Dave identified some of the artisans who produced the most valuable steins, and he told us that depending on where and by whom a stein was manufactured, its value can range from a few dollars to well over one thousand dollars. Dave recommended that someone who desires to build a collection should concentrate on a particular feature or artist.

Several of the attendees also brought some of their own steins. They each took a few minutes to tell us how they came in the possession of their steins, and the personal memories attached to each piece. Lively conversations about the decorations found on each stein rounded out a very pleasant evening.

8/6 Celle Runde

Eight people met on Saturday 8/6 to talk about German news over a cup of hot coffee. Several of the attendees asked Barbara to give them a short presentation on how to link a computer to a TV to view internet German TV programs. During the demonstration, the group came across a very interesting German program about the political events which led to the erection of the Berlin Wall. The show also discussed the policies which led the East German government to use lethal force to prevent its citizen from escaping to the west.



Other News

Tulsa-Celle-Partnership Education Stipends

Over the past two years, the partnership has set up two new programs to promote cultural exchanges between our two cities. The first program consists of one annual \$500 stipend for a greater Tulsa area teacher who wants to take a group of five or more students to Celle, and is planning on attending a minimum of five classroom days while in Celle with his/her students.



The second program consists of two \$250 stipends per school year for greater Tulsa area students who want to spend at least four weeks in Celle to improve their German fluency. Daniel Pham took advantage of this program earlier this year. We have now started a new school year and we hope that two new students will take advantage of this program.

In addition to our usual mailings to local teachers, we ask that our Tulsa-Celle-Partnership members publicize these stipends to friends who are either teachers, or have children interested in going to Celle to further their studies.
